



CYPRUS

With a beautiful and largely unspoilt coastline and a mountainous interior, the third largest island in the Mediterranean is a kaleidoscopic blend of histories and cultures.



An island that is a world unto itself, Cyprus breathes the spirit of three continents and numerous empires. Ever since the New Stone Age, Europe, Africa and Asia have left their various marks, from the Pharaohs of Egypt to the Emperors of Rome, from Ottoman Sultans to Knight Crusaders and Venetian Doges, in a great spread of cultural treasures and antiquities.

The long coastline is studded with glorious beaches and small fishing villages, and holiday resorts have been established to cater for all tastes – a few less attractive than others. There remains, though, an abundance of small, relaxed locations that continue to offer the

type of warm-hearted, genial hospitality that typifies a Greek island holiday, with a sapphire sea, breathtaking scenery, delicious Mezes, and time to spare.

Away from the coast, it is as if you have passed into another century, with sleepy villages nestling in the spectacular Troodos Mountains, amidst goats, olive and lemon groves, and in springtime some of the most wonderful displays of wild flowers on earth.

POMOS

Beneath the wooded foothills of the Paphos mountains lies the large village of Pomos. Blessed with a variety of small coves, beaches and rock pools, and overlooked by volcanic crags and innumerable circling birds, Pomos is a restful delight.

A renowned sea-food restaurant, the Kanali, benefits from the local fish caught and brought into the tiny, newly-built harbour. Pomos and the surrounding villages have a variety of family run restaurants a short drive away.

PRODROMI

The small village of Prodromi, with its traditional bakery, minimarket and several tavernas is 1 km from Polis and, in reality, is a suburb of the town. It is a 10 minute walk to the centre of Polis with its shops, restaurants and cafes and 20 minutes' walk through olive and citrus groves to the sea and the sand/shingle beaches of Latchi.

LATCHI

Between Polis and the Baths of Aphrodite, Latchi with its Blue Flag Beach is more a collection of fish tavernas and shops than a village. The place to come to for freshly caught fish at a waterside restaurant after a walk in the peaceful Akamas or a swim at one of the nearby beaches. Boat trips leave from the harbour and motorboats can be rented.

PEYIA

A very large, almost overwhelmingly friendly village, now designated a town with its own municipality. Peyia is spread across the hills about 3.5kms from Coral Bay and 15kms from Paphos. There are many coffee shops, grocers and heartily welcoming tavernas which provide simple but excellent food at very reasonable prices. Coral Bay beach is 10 minutes' drive.











VILLAS STELLA MARIS & BUFFAVENTO

NEAR POMOS • CYPRUS

Set your sights towards the sky at Villas Stella Maris and Buffavento. Situated just above a stunning volcanic cliffside, these villas offers incredible views of the mountains and the chance to relax under the stars. Use the provided telescopes to see which constellations you can spot or just look out the windows with all the lights off to lose yourself in night sky here.

Up to six people can enjoy the villas more than comfortably, and the properties are particularly suited to couples, families with older children and groups of friends. When you're not taken in by the fantastic views, you can appreciate the modern interiors and private swimming pool that make you feel truly at home.

Foodies will love the choice of restaurants available in the local villages. Have an incredible evening out dining on Greek Cypriot classics while the sun sets behind the mountains. If you're looking for something a little more action-packed, visit nearby sandy coves perfect for splashing around and cooling off in the midday heat.

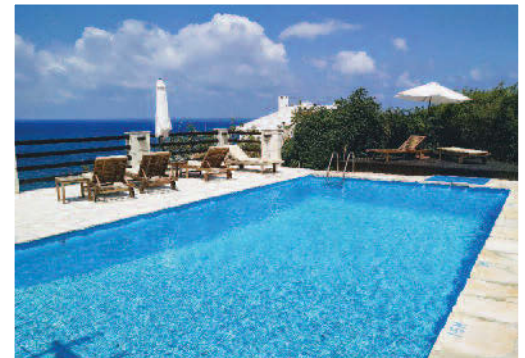

VILLA SPILIO

ANAVARGOS • CYPRUS

Built on top of the ancient ruins of a Cyprus church, Villa Spilio is where history comes to life. An old bread oven has been carefully preserved as part of the property, and the original village house has been turned into the living room. Smell the blossoms of the garden as you make your way to the swimming pool out back, or enjoy the views towards Paphos and the sea.

With two floors, Villa Spilio suits families and friends. On warm days, choose between the cool interior or basking in the sun on the terrace. When it's cooler outside, open fireplaces will keep you cosy.

You wouldn't know by the tranquil atmosphere inside the villa, but there are two tavernas just steps away that fill the area with live music a few nights a week. This adds to the uplifting atmosphere in the village, where the name of the game is to let loose and have some well-deserved fun on your holiday.
