# Lecce & Puglia



Puglia, on Italy's heel, has coastlines along the Adriatic and Ionian Seas. The landscape varies dramatically from scenic mountains, oak and beech forests and unspoilt beaches in the north to the fertile Tavoliere plain. The centre gives way to an undulating plateau

## 'Le Murge' and in the south the dry Salentine peninsula.

Steeped in myths and legends, Puglia's history dates back to the civilisation of the Magna Grecia. The region has many splendid cathedrals and ancient sites including the Castel del Monte in Andria – the most extraordinary of all Puglia's castles; The Greek and Roman ruins of Egnasia; The Norman Cathedral in Trani and the Baroque buildings and Roman amphitheatre of Lecce, dubbed 'Florence of the South'.



#### Alberobello

This UNESCO World Heritage site is home to a dense concentration of trulli cottages with cone-shaped roofs (dating from 15th-18th centuries) and one of the best preserved urban areas of its type in Europe.



#### Castel del Monte

Located in Andria, this 13th century citadel and castle was constructed for Emperor Frederick Il although no-one actually lived in it. This fascinating hexagonalshaped castle is protected as a UNESCO World Heritage site.



#### Otranto

Visit the 11th century Cathedral with its mosaic floor of the 'tree of life', intertwining Norman, Greek and Byzantine ideas of fate. The Chapel of the Dead displays skulls and bones of local martyrs.



#### Molfetta, Trani and Barletta

Molfetta, the first of a trio of port towns north of Bari, has a walled medieval centre; Trani is dominated by a grand Romanesque cathedral; and Barletta has a third-century bronze colossus.

# Pugliese Cuisine

Puglia has an excellent cuisine and is an important producer of olive oil, olives and almonds. Bread comes in hundreds of varieties including taralli - a kind of Italian pretzel, softened with olive oil and sprinkled with chopped tomatoes.

#### Marè Resort, Trani

This charming hotel is set in the historic centre of Trani just opposite the port with its colourful fishing boats and seaside promenade. The Marè Resort, housed within the Palazzo Telesio - a grand 18th century building, has a rooftop terrace with panoramic views where guests can dine on the local cuisine at the Terrazza restaurant. The hotel also has a fascinating collection of coaches belonging to the Telesio family since 1956. Guests can walk or cycle to the nearby beaches.

The owner has retained many of the features of the original buildings, including vaulted ceilings, arches and the original, local stone 'Pietra di Lecce'flooring. This charming property offers intimate guestrooms, simply furnished and decorated with antique pieces, in quiet and refined surroundings. The sandy beaches are within a 2km drive. # Ostuni

Ostuni is a melee of white-washed buildings perched strategically on top of a hillside with panoramic views of endless olive trees in the Valle d'Itria countryside.

# Alluring Puglia

#### Itinerary: 10 days / 9 nights

Puglia, which forms the heel of Italy's boot, is the long, narrow region of southern Italy bordering the Adriatic Sea and the regions of Basilicata, Campania and Molise. Beautiful beaches, secluded coves, fields of olive and citrus groves, Baroque towns, whitewashed villages and fascinating conical-shaped trulli houses are just some of the many attractions to be discovered in the region.

Day One: Arrive at Bari airport, collect your hire car and drive to your hotel in Trani (41km).

**Day Two:** Day at leisure. Explore the historic city of Trani. Formerly a prosperous trading centre with a large mercantile and Jewish community, Trani was important enough to compete with the domineering Venetians in the 14th century.

Day Three: Day at leisure – Head north to the Gargano National Park (207km / 2 hours 20-minutes) which contains several protected areas such as the Marine Reserve of the Tremiti Islands. The Gargano promontory consists of a wide mountain massif made up of highlands and several peaks, projecting into the Adriatic Sea. The park offers good walking trails and cycle routes; a glimpse of hundreds of species of animals including deer, foxes and birds; and the majestic beaches at Peschici and Vieste.

**Day Four:** After breakfast, drive south to Fasano (106km) and the Borgo San Marco. This fortified masseria is set within 450 acres of cultivated land and olive groves – the owners are major producers of extra virgin olive oil.

Day Five: Day at leisure – visit Alberobello (17km), inscribed on UNESCO's World Heritage list. Home to more than a thousand trulli houses – whitewashed, conical shaped buildings built centuries ago as homes and tool stores, and typical to this region.

**Day Six:** Day at leisure – spend time bathing on the Adriatic coast (2km). Mile upon mile of wide sandy beaches are within easy striking distance.

Days Seven & Eight: Days at leisure. Spend a day exploring Lecce. Affectionately known as the 'Florence of the South' due to its many Baroque buildings, Lecce has a Roman amphitheatre, more than a hundred churches and palaces and several designer boutiques. Spend the next day at Porto Cesareo (65km), located on the southwest coast of Puglia. This seaside resort is famous for its 17km of golden sand beaches.

Day Nine: Day at leisure. Drive to Otranto (48km) on the east coast of the Salento peninsula. It has a bustling seafront and many architectural gems including the 15th century Castello Aragonese and the Cathedral.

Day Ten: Drive to Bari airport (163km) for your flight home.



# A Taste of Apulia (Guided Tour)

#### Itinerary: 5 days / 4 nights

Take a chauffeur driven tour of Puglia and Basilicata, steeped in Etruscan and Greek sites. You will have the expert guidance of official guides in Lecce and Matera (nominated as the European Capital of Culture for 2019) and experience some of the most interesting historic towns and villages in Puglia including Alberobello Locorotondo, Cisternino, Ostuni and Lecce.

Day One - Alberobello: Arrive at Bari airport, meet and greet by your personal driver and transfer to your hotel in Alberobello.

Alberobello is a UNESCO World Heritage site and home to a dense concentration of Trulli limestone cottages with cone-shaped roofs built between the mid 15th and late 18th centuries. It is one of the best preserved urban areas of its type in Europe. Overnight stay at Grand Hotel Olimpo, Alberobello.

Day Two - Matera (Half Day): After breakfast, pick up from your hotel and depart for Matera (c.70 minutes' drive / 70.3km), a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The town centre, the oldest part of town, was built on the edge of a bare plateau where a high rocky mount looms over the spot where a valley descends to the long deep river-ravine. This is where you will find the cathedral and the typical Italian town centre. As time passed, the rocky valley slopes below the town were dug out to create caves, used for housing, storage and stabling. These cave areas, where the poorest local peasants lived, fill a narrow valley and run along the side of the gorge itself. Matera was used as a film location for Mel Gibson's 'The Passion of Christ'. Afternoon at leisure. Overnight stay at Grand Hotel Olimpo, Alberobello.

Day Three - Itria Valley (Full Day): After breakfast, you will be chauffer driven through the Itria Valley, to the picturesque Locorotondo – known as one of the most beautiful villages in Italy; Cisternino, a medieval walled city where you can stroll back through time on worn, stone-paved lanes between ancient palaces, towers, shops and homes that are mostly still in use today; Ostuni, the old citadel is built on top of a hill surrounded by ancient walls and is commonly referred to as the White Town (Città Bianca) for its white walls and white-painted architecture; and the baroque Martina Franca, the pearl of Valle d'Itria, a hilltop town whose historical centre is surrounded by stone walls, with prominent baroque gates that lead to piazzas and narrow medieval streets. Lunch (included) will be at a farmhouse where the region's celebrated olive oil and wine will accompany your meal. Overnight stay at Patria Palace Hotel, Lecce.

Day Four - Lecce (Half Day): Today you will have a half day guided walking tour of Lecce. Affectionately known as the 'Florence of the South' due to its

many Baroque buildings, Lecce has a Roman amphitheatre, more than a hundred churches and palaces and several designer boutiques. The city's heyday was when it was part of Spain in the 17th century and the noblemen, merchants and religious orders of the city competed with each other as to who could build the most palaces. Carved from the local golden sandstone, the exuberant architecture looks like a sumptuous theatrical set. Lunch included. Afternoon at leisure. Overnight stay at Patria Palace Hotel, Lecce.

**Day Five:** Transfer to Bari airport for your flight back to the UK.
