



Florence & Tuscany



The Tuscan landscape is dotted with cypresses, vineyard-covered hills and walled towns forming the backdrop for its classic Renaissance art which flourished in the 15th-16th centuries. Michelangelo Buonarroti, along with Leonardo Da Vinci, were two of the most

prodigious talents to influence the artists that followed through the centuries.

Many of their works can be viewed in Florence, one of the greatest artistic treasure-houses of the world. But Florence is not only history and culture; shopping here is a delight, especially amidst the tiny jewellery shops on the Ponte Vecchio; there are the Boboli Gardens - the finest in Tuscany - and the local cuisine and regional wines which are simply divine.

The historic centres of Florence, Siena, Pienza and San Gimignano; the Medici Villas and gardens of Tuscany; the grand Piazza del Duomo in Pisa; and the Val d'Orcia.



Michelangelo's 'David'

No visit to Florence would be complete without seeing Michelangelo's most famous masterpiece. The statue, completed between 1501 and 1503, depicts David before his historic victory over Goliath.



The Palio

A twice yearly (2nd July and 16th August) horse race takes place in Siena's main piazza. This colourful medieval event celebrates competition between neighbourhoods (contrade) to win the coveted painted silk banner 'palio'.



Medieval hilltop towns

Visit the charming towns of Montepulciano, Montalcino, Cortona, Rocca d'Orcia and Pienza surrounded by the stunning bucolic Tuscan countryside.

Uffizi Gallery, Florence

This magnificent art museum exhibits great Renaissance art by the masters - from Giotto and Botticelli to Da Vinci and Michelangelo. A truly brain-draining experience but worth the viewing.

Brunelleschi Hotel, Florence

The Brunelleschi Hotel is a well known name in Florence with a fine reputation for quality and service. Located in the heart of Florence in the centre of the historical downtown area, it overlooks Brunelleschi's Cathedral, just a few steps from the Uffizi Gallery and other famous museums. The hotel has been designed around one of the oldest buildings in Florence, a 6th century Byzantine tower "La Pagliazza" and has many ancient walls and ceilings within the property.

Degli Orafi Hotel, Florence

This historic building has retained many original architectural features including the partially restored remains of an ancient tower and the fabulous frescoes - dating from the 19th century - which adorn the walls of the breakfast room. There is a bar with a panoramic terrace overlooking the River Arno, Palazzo Vecchio and the Cathedral (Duomo). Its location couldn't be better placed next to both the Ponte Vecchio, with its charming shops and street vendors, and the Uffizi museum.

Pisa, Lucca & Volterra

Pisa is home to the iconic Leaning Tower, built in 1372. Lucca is known for its intact Renaissance-era walls, Roman street plan and the site of an ancient forum. Volterra, once Etruscan and later Roman, is now one of the best known centres for the turning and polishing of alabaster.

Grand Hotel Bonanno, Pisa

This centrally located 4-star hotel is within close proximity of Piazza dei Miracoli, Museo delle Sinopie, Orto Botanico (botanical gardens) and a 10 minute walk to the impressive Leaning Tower of Pisa. Etruscan Cities

Tuscany is considered to be the cradle of Etruscan civilization (9BC to 1AD). Ancient Etruria was centred on twelve great Etruscan cities, which included Arezzo, Cortona, San Gimignano and Volterra.

La Cisterna Hotel, San Gimignano

In the centre of San Gimignano is the ancient Cistern Square where La Cisterna Hotel stands, one façade overlooking the square and the other towards Val d'Elsa, some of the loveliest scenery in Tuscany. This 14th century building has been furnished in a style perfectly in keeping with the charm of its surroundings. A unique hotel and a town not to be missed.

Borgo Tre Rose, Valiano di Montepulciano

Set in the heart of Tuscany between Montepulciano and Cortona, the Borgo is a medieval hilltop hamlet that has been restored and transformed into a relaxing country retreat. All the rooms have been created within six farm buildings and have been decorated in a classical Tuscan style with light wood furniture, terracotta floors and exposed beams. Traditional Tuscan dishes and an excellent selection of wines are served in the restaurant, which has a panoramic terrace offering stunning views over the surrounding countryside.

Fattoria Lavacchio, Pontassieve

Fields of vineyards and olive groves in the Florentine hills of Montefiesole surround the Fattoria Lavacchio. The estate covers 110 hectares, twenty-one of which are vineyards that cultivate a variety of grapes and produce some excellent wines, namely Fontegalli, Cedro (riserva), Chianti Rufina and Oro del Cedro. Wine tasting, tours of the olive oil factory, cookery courses, horse riding, mountain biking and pottery classes are some of the many activities offered.

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Tuscan Delights

Itinerary: 8 days / 7 nights

This is a region that has been endowed with a combination of natural beauty and an unparalleled artistic legacy. Our suggested itinerary includes places you would not want to miss plus some lesser known places that will reveal the real Tuscany.

Day One: Arrive at Pisa airport, collect your hire car and drive to your hotel. Lucca is a charming town, completely surrounded by 16th century walls, with narrow cobbled alleyways and elegant boutiques.

Day Two: Take the train to Pisa. No visit to Tuscany is complete without a visit to the famous Leaning Tower. Next to the tower are the Baptistery and Duomo, which combine to help make this one of the most attractive squares in Italy.

Day Three: Take the train to Florence. Visit the Duomo (designed by Filippo Brunelleschi), located next to the Campanile and Baptistery, the Piazza della Signoria (the historical centre of Florence), the Uffizi art gallery and the 14th century Ponte Vecchio which spans the River Arno.

Day Four: Enjoy a scenic drive through the beautiful Tuscan countryside en-route to the ancient hilltop town of Siena. This medieval town was built on three hills and at its heart is the huge square, Piazza del Campo. Twice a year the colourful horse race known


as the Palio takes place in this central square as competitors from each district within the town race around its cobbled streets.

Day Five: Spend the day exploring the Chianti region with its gentle hills interspersed with fields of vineyards and olive groves and small stone villages. Don't forget to taste the local wine en route.

Day Six: Drive north to the picturesque hilltop town of San Gimignano. This Etruscan town is characterised by its beautifully preserved towers. This charming medieval town is criss-crossed with narrow cobbled streets and lanes and the Torre Grossa (54m) provides stunning views over the Tuscan countryside.

Day Seven: Enjoy a scenic drive to Volterra. Stretching out along a high ridge, this ancient settlement has its roots in over three thousand years of history. In fact, it is possible to find traces from every historical period which gives the town a unique place in Tuscan history. Etruscan artefacts have been found in abundance in this area and the Museo Guarnacci houses a large collection of objects including some funerary urns, some of which date back to the 9th century BC.

Day Eight: Drive back to Pisa for your return flight home.
