Getting there

There is a good choice of carriers from the UK to Peru. Direct flight from London Gatwick to Lima with British Airways. Flights from London Heathrow with KLM (via Amsterdam) and Iberia (via Madrid). Avianca also operate a service from London Heathrow via Bogota. Regional departures include Manchester, Birmingham, Cardiff, Bristol, Humberside, Newcastle and Edinburgh.

Lima

Lima is enjoying a renaissance, with fine colonial architecture, world-class museums and award-winning restaurants. A number of the hotels can be found in the cosmopolitan district of Miraflores with its numerous bars, restaurants and attractive parks. We also offer accommodation in the neighbouring Barranco district with its bohemian character and the residential San Isidro district. With splendid Spanish colonial squares and churches that date back to the early 16th century, along with the vast indigenous collections inside the Archaeological museum, the city offers many treasures.

Crowne Plaza Lima

Lima **BB**

This 5 star hotel is conveniently located in the upmarket Miraflores district. The facilities include the Sinfonia Restaurant offering an array of international and local dishes, the Opera Bar providing a good selection of cocktails, an indoor swimming pool and fitness centre. There are 96 stylish air-conditioned rooms decorated in warm colours and featuring flat-screen TVs, desk and a safe deposit box. Upgraded rooms include complimentary WiFi, iPod docking stations and separate sitting areas. Suites feature a whirlpool bathtub.

Northern Peru

Trujillo, Chiclayo, Cajamarca, Chachapoyas

The north is still relatively undiscovered, despite its wealth of pre-Inca archaeological sites and intriguing landscapes. An elegant colonial city, Trujillo also has some fine beaches nearby that are popular for surfing and excellent seafood. Chan Chan, dating from 1100, features the extraordinary remains of the world's largest adobe city. Dominating the area around Chiclayo are the 26 pyramids of Tucume, part of 3 distinct pyramid cities consisting of 250 constructions. Surrounded by mountains, Cajamarca is where Atahualpa, the last Inca lord, was executed. For the more adventurous, a journey exploring the mountains around Chachapoyas on the road from Leymebamba to Cajamarca is a thrilling challenge.



Hotel Libertador

Trujillo **BB**

The Libertador is an elegant colonial property, conveniently located on the corner of the main square next to the cathedral. This comfortable hotel has 73 air-conditioned rooms furnished to a good standard, including private facilities, a hair dryer, direct dial telephone, cable TV and a safe deposit box. The majority of the rooms overlook an interior courtyard which houses a small swimming pool. Las Bovedas restaurant serves regional dishes including fish and a selection of other seafood choices.

OUR TOP TIPS

Chan Chan - experience the adobe splendour of this wonderfully well-preserved pre-Columbian city near Trujillo • Kuelap - visit this impressive site in a stunning mountain-top location, Kuelap was built by the Chachapoyans over 200 years. The ruins included a fortress, and many houses covered by trees and bromeliads.

Arequipa

Flanked by the three snow capped volcanoes of Misti, Chachani and Pichu Pichu, Arequipa is known as “The White City” because of its construction from “sillar”, a white volcanic rock. Basking in its dry, sunny climate, it has preserved the beauty of its colonial styled buildings and has many older, architectural treasures. A key attraction is the labyrinthine convent of Santa Catalina, a vast complex of brightly painted avenues and courtyards. It is also the world centre of the Alpaca wool industry.



Casa Andina Premium Arequipa **BB**

This boutique hotel is set in a colonial building dating from the late 18th century. Situated three blocks from the main square, the hotel has 41 rooms and suites positioned around two courtyards. The majority of rooms are located in a new part of the hotel but 3 suites, the reception and restaurant are located in the original building.

Colca Canyon

Reached by a scenic overland journey from either Arequipa or Lake Titicaca. Said by some to be the “Lost valley of the Incas”, the stunning Colca Canyon is twice as deep as the Grand Canyon. Here people still live and work on the pre-Inca terraced fields which cling to the verdant canyon walls. Hopefully you will catch a glimpse of the mighty Andean condor as they soar on the thermals above the valley - an unforgettable experience!



Colca Lodge Colca Valley **BB**

Built on the banks of the Colca River and surrounded by hundreds of pre-Inca agricultural terraces. There are 45 rooms and suites with private facilities. From the restaurant there are panoramic views of the valley and mountains. In addition, there is a bar and lounge. A key attraction of the lodge are the relaxing thermal pools.

Lake Titicaca

This sacred lake, the birthplace of the Incas, covers an enormous area of 3,200 square miles, sinks to a depth of 1,000 feet and is the highest navigable lake in the world. The lake is dotted with islands, many with ancient traditions. The Uros Floating Islands are man-made and built from totora reeds. Amantani Island is famed for its basket-weaving, and on the island of Taquile the inhabitants still speak the ancient Quechua language, and there are no roads or electricity. Instead, a proud community still asserts its individuality, through farming, fishing and traditional clothes. During a boat trip you can view the spectacular snow-capped Cordillera Real mountain range.



Casa Andina Premium Puno Lake Titicaca **BB**

Positioned on the shores of Lake Titicaca this hotel is a good base from which to explore this beautiful region. It has 44 rooms and one suite, all with private facilities (bath & shower), telephone, heater, hairdryer, safe deposit box, cable TV and coffee making facilities. The hotel facilities include a gourmet restaurant, a lobby bar, a terrace with views over the lake and a private pier for lake excursions. Lake view rooms are recommended.



Titilaka Hotel Lake Titicaca **FB**

An hours drive from Puno, this luxury lodge is set on a secluded private peninsula that provides spectacular views across Lake Titicaca to the rugged Andean landscape beyond. The amenities include an intimate lake view restaurant serving regional and international cuisine and a relaxing spa offering various treatments. The accommodation consist of 18 stylish lake view rooms. Dawn rooms have eastern views across Lake Titicaca, whilst Dusk rooms have views towards the western horizon. The Corner rooms offer both dawn and dusk views. Guests can choose from variety of daily activities (included).



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Cusco

Once the most important city of the Inca Empire, Cusco is now arguably the archaeological capital of the Americas. Despite being the gateway to Machu Picchu and the Sacred valley, it has managed to retain much of its historical integrity. The massive grandeur of Inca stonework exists alongside cobblestoned streets overlooked by multi-coloured colonial houses with wrought-iron balconies. History is in the fabric of the city; at Qorikancha you will find an Inca temple complex, in the Barrio de San Blas you walk the zigzag streets of the Incas, whilst in the Gothic Renaissance Cathedral you encounter a stunning collection of Cusquenian art. A treasure trove of archaeology, Cusco still pulses with vibrant, colourful life.



Inkaterra La Casona

Cusco **BB**

Located a short stroll from Cusco's main square in the heart of the old sector, this discreet mansion is a slice of elegant luxury. The 11 luxury suites are all furnished to a very high standard and are found either on the upper balcony or on the ground floor overlooking the courtyard. Suites feature a king sized bed, dining area, en-suite spacious bathroom with stand-alone bath and separate shower. Due to the compact size of the manor house, guests will be surprised at its intimacy; it is more like a private residence than a hotel.

El Mercado

Cusco **BB**

This boutique hotel is located in the heart of Cusco, just a 5 minute walk from the main square and Cathedral. Here modern design has been paired with traditional colonial-style architecture to create a stylish property. Open for lunch and dinner La Taberna restaurant and bar offers freshly cooked dishes using locally grown ingredients. Guests can enjoy a meal or drinks in the lovely central courtyard. The 31 well appointed guest rooms have en-suite bathrooms with shower and feature cable TV, direct dial phone, Wifi, and safe deposit box. Highly recommended.

The Sacred Valley

Carved out by the Urubamba river, the Sacred valley remains a lush agricultural region of great beauty that once was home to thriving Inca settlements. Today you are still surrounded by evidence of past glories: the lines of agricultural terraces, for instance, or the magnificent ruins of the Sun Temple at Pisac – which rival Machu Picchu and the Inca village and fortress at Ollantaytambo. The valley remains abundantly alive: there is the fascinating Quechua village at Chinchero, the kaleidoscopic variety of textiles on offer at Pisac market and the extraordinary salt pans at Maras, with the sunlight dazzling on a maze of ponds.

Sol y Luna Lodge & Spa

Urubamba **BB**

This hotel is located in a picturesque spot close to the town of Urubamba. There are 43 colourful casitas built from local materials and dotted around beautiful flower-filled gardens. The lodge facilities include a restaurant serving international and Peruvian cuisine, a lounge bar, a swimming pool, a spa and stables. Offering outdoor, gastronomic and cultural activities, Sol y Luna is perfect for travellers of all ages including families. Charming property.



Pakaritampu Hotel

Ollantaytambo **BB**

This modest hotel is only a short walk away from Ollantaytambo Station from where the trains depart for Machu Picchu. It is also ideally located for visits to Ollantaytambo Inca fortress and the high Andean community of Willoc. It is surrounded by mountains and the mature gardens. The rooms have private facilities, plenty of natural light and warm wooden furnishings. The property also has a lounge with a fireplace, a reading room, an attractive restaurant, a cosy bar and a small gift shop.



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Machu Picchu

Sublime, unique and unfathomable, suspended high in the cloud forest, the Inca citadel of Machu Picchu is without question one of the “Seven New Wonders of the World”. Hidden until 1911, the site remains clouded in mystery in every sense. Was it a military outpost? a ceremonial site? a country resort for the Inca elite? Nobody really knows. What is clear, though, is that the effort and craftsmanship involved in its construction are without parallel. Even though you may feel prepared for the experience, there is nothing to match the extraordinary sense of actually being there!



Inkaterra Machu Picchu Pueblo Hotel

Aguas Calientes **HB**

Set in five hectares of cloud forest, the grounds of this hotel host numerous species of orchids, birds, butterflies, reptiles and mammals. In addition, the hotel endeavours to promote contact with nature and local culture by providing on site ecotourism activities such as nature walks, slide shows and bird-watching. The accommodation consists of 83 en-suite rooms built in Andean style and set amongst tropical gardens. The property has an attractive restaurant overlooking the Vilcanota River. Other facilities include the Una Spa, library, reading room and a cozy bar. Our preferred choice in Aguas Calientes.

Trains to Machu Picchu

Trains for the scenic ride to Machu Picchu depart from Cusco (Poroy) or Ollantaytambo. We generally book our travellers on the Vistadome Train which is comfortable and has panoramic windows. The Belmond luxury train, Hiram Bingham, runs every day except the last Sunday of each month and can be booked at a supplement. All trains arrive at the village of Aguas Calientes where you meet your guide and continue by minibus up the mountain side to the entrance of the site.

Inca Trail

One of the most iconic treks in the world which follows the ancient path used by messengers bringing news from outposts of the Inca empire to the citadel. The Classic Inca Trail takes four days and includes three nights camping. A guide, porters, camping equipment (except for duffle bags and sleeping bags) and all meals are provided when booked through us. A certain level of fitness is essential as the altitude and weather conditions can make the trek extremely tough. An alternative option is the Express Inca Trail which is a one day strenuous walk. Book in advance to secure a trek permit. Normally closes for the month of February.



Mountain Lodges of Peru

If you are keen to trek in the Andes but would prefer not to camp, these extended walks are a wonderful option. The **Salkantay Trek** is a 6 night lodge-to-lodge trek that traverses a mountain pass over 15,000 feet en route to Machu Picchu. With an emphasis on scenery, wildlife and local Andean culture this exciting trek follows an ancient trail through the spectacular Cordillera Vilcabamba mountain range. The 4 or 6 night **Sacred Valley and Lares Adventure** is a multi-activity lodge-to-lodge experience that also finishes at Machu Picchu.

All of the lodges have comfortable bedrooms, (with en-suite facilities including hot showers), a dining room and a bar/lounge. Groups are small, averaging 10 people and are accompanied by experienced guides. The board basis is all-inclusive, except for alcoholic beverages, souvenirs, tips and additional services such as treatments. There is a minimum age of 12 and a good level of physical fitness is required. Please contact us for further details.



The Peruvian Amazon

One of the best places in South America to observe wildlife. Almost half of Peru lies in the Amazon basin, the most biodiverse region in the world. Two contrasting areas of the Amazon can be visited in Peru and you can choose from a lodge-based stay or a luxury cruise (see opposite page). The Tambopata Reserve is a national reserve in the southern Peruvian Amazon and is home to more than 600 bird species; 200 mammal species; over 1,000 types of butterfly and 10,000 plant species as well as thousands of different insects and many amphibians and reptiles. Iquitos in the northern Peruvian Amazon is the jumping-off point for river cruises.

OUR TOP TIPS

Try and spot the poison dart frog leaping through the undergrowth or giant anteaters skulking through winding forest trails • Look for pink dolphins in the north (Iquitos)



Rainforest Expeditions Lodges

Tambopata, Amazon Basin **FB**

They operate three lodges in the Tambopata region. The 30-room Posada Amazonas which is owned by the Ese Ejja community, located 45 minutes by boat from Puerto Maldonado; Refugio Amazonas, a 32 room eco-lodge located in a Brazil nut forest located 4 hours from Puerto Maldonado (recommended for families) and the Tambopata Research Centre (TRC) an eco-lodge and research centre which is one of the most remote lodges in South America with the largest known macaw clay licks in the Amazon. Each lodge offers daily tours and activities visiting lakes, clay licks, canopy towers and rainforest trails. There is a good opportunity for spotting monkeys, cayman, toucans, capybara and macaws.



Inkaterra Amazon Lodges

Tambopata, Amazon Basin **FB**

Inkaterra offers two Amazon lodges set on the banks of the Madre de Dios River. Inkaterra Reserva Amazonica has 35 cabanas and (further along the river) the Inkaterra Hacienda Concepción has 19 cabanas and 6 standard rooms in the main lodge. The wooden cabanas have private facilities and are built in a traditional Amazonian style (on small stilts) with private enclosed terraces. The standard rooms at the Hacienda Concepción also have private facilities and feature wooden floors and rustic Amazonian furniture. Each lodge has a main building where meals are enjoyed and an eco-centre where excursions are arranged. The Reserva Amazonicas' unique ENA Spa offers treatments using exotic ingredients taken from the jungle. Both lodges include a choice of daily group guided wildlife activities.



MV Aria

Iquitos 3, 4 & 7 night itineraries **FB**

Sailing from Iquitos to the pristine Pacaya Samiria Reserve, the MV Aria is a luxury boutique boat that offers unprecedented levels of comfort. It has 16 suites, all with extra large windows that allow uninterrupted views of the stunning Amazon panorama. Daily small group guided excursions are taken in skiffs lead by experienced local naturalist guides. It is possible to encounter pink dolphins, monkeys, parrots, piranhas, sloths and much more. Gourmet food, featuring exclusive Peruvian themed menus, is served throughout the cruise. In addition, there is an observation deck, with indoor and outdoor lounges, that provides a perfect place to relax and admire the tranquillity of the Amazon as it gently floats by.



Wet and Dry Seasons

60% of the total rainfall in the Amazon falls in the wet season. The wet season runs from December to May and is the cooler of the two seasons. The river is approximately 23 feet higher meaning creeks, tributaries and lakes are more navigable – allowing access to the heart of the jungle by boat. The dry season runs from June to November and although there's still some rain the trails that were flooded are now accessible on foot whilst access by small boat is more limited.
