

Andalucia Activities 2018

Sunvil can pre-book a variety of activities in Andalucia, Spain which can be bolted on to any itinerary - full details below.

Please note that any pre-booked activity with Sunvil must be requested 14 days or more before departure.

RONDA

Take a leisurely stroll through the streets of Ronda, absorbing every detail of this ancient Arab medina (city) on the south bank of the Guadalevín River. Cross the Puente Nuevo (new bridge) from which you will be treated to a marvellous view and wander around the Alameda del Tajo where you can absorb history at every corner. Then restore your strength in one of the restaurants offering an abundant selection of dishes from the local cuisine.

The town itself is divided into three clearly distinct areas: the city, or old Arab Medina, which is the most important from an historical point of view; the neighbourhood of San Francisco, separated by the city Walls; and the Mercadillo neighbourhood, which is on the other side of the Guadalevín River.

Buggy driving - RONDA

This guided experience allows you to steer a two-seated buggy to areas rarely visited by tourists. Follow the guide for a 20km ride and enjoy some breathtaking views off the beaten track.

Vineyard Tour - RONDA

Get to know the local vineyards and wineries and learn all about the wine making process. This tour will start with a welcome reception at the winery followed by a visit of the vineyards and end with some wine tasting accompanied by a selection of Andalusian tapas.

GRANADA

At the foot of the Sierra Nevada stands the province's capital city, Granada, which is a fusion of western and eastern civilisations. The capital of the former Nasrid kingdom, the old city preserves an urban atmosphere with picturesque areas. The Alhambra, one of the most fascinating monumental sites in the world, overlooks the city.

Alhambra Palace (Guided tour joining a group) - Granada Price is £29 per adult, £21 per teenager (14-18 years) and £14 per child (8-13 years)

Divided into four main areas – the Palaces, the Alcazaba, the Medina and the Generalife Estate, either a full morning or afternoon visit is recommended to really appreciate this wondrous monument. Reachable on foot (1.6km) or by public transport, due to its popularity and limited visitors per day, it is recommended to book visits to the Alhambra in advance, subject to availability.

Guided Bike Tour - Granada

Visit Granada by electric bike and discover the some of the many marvels this beautiful city has to offer. The guided tour explores the typical districts of Albaicín and Sacromonte, the gypsy caves and San Nicolas viewpoint.

ARCOS DE LA FRONTERA

Guided walk - Arcos de la Frontera

Take a guided walk along the narrow, steep streets and under ancient archways to discover the ancient quarter. Monumental treasures in this part of the town include the Los Duques Castle (15th century), the Matrera Gateway (11th-14th centuries) and the remains of the walled town, with its palaces and manor houses, the Santa María Basilica, the San Pedro Church, as well as numerous churches, chapels and convents. All these places of worship house valuable images which are paraded through the streets of the town during Easter Week.

Kayak Tour - Arcos Lake

Arcos Lake is only a few kilometres from the town where visitors can try their hand at various water sports. The tail of this reservoir has been declared a Beauty Spot.

LOS CAÑOS DE MECA

Horse Riding

Horse riding along El Palmar beach (weather dependent), located 10km from Los Caños de Meca. Before going out to the beach you will spend some time at the riding school getting to know your horse which will be chosen depending on your experience level.

Whale & Dolphin Watching Trip

The waters off the coast of Andalucia are home to a large population of whales and dolphins. Orcas are always present on the Costa de la Luz and the Straights of Gibraltar, however it is the summer period (mid July to mid Sep) when they are most visible. The most frequently spotted cetaceans are Orca (killer whale), Common Rorqual (baleen whale), Minke whale, Sperm whale and Common and Striped dolphins.

Price is £40 per adult and £25 per child (4-14 years) or £12 per toddler (1-3 years)

- Boat capacity 60 people or 150 people
- Each excursion starts with a 10 minute briefing by a marine biologist, introducing the cetaceans and discussing their habitat, communication and behavioural patterns
- Dolphins and pilot whales are sighted all year round, sperm whales during spring, summer and autumn and killer whales in summer
- 97% success on sightings at least one species of cetacean. Should you be unlucky enough not to see any sightings of cetaceans, then you will be given a free ticket, without expiration date, to go out again

CADIZ

A visit to the Supply Market or Square (Mercado de Abastos) is a must. You are sure to discover a corner replete with daily life, where the people of Cadiz 'Gaditanos' chat with traders while they do their daily shopping.

Try the traditional breakfast 'Churros and Hot chocolate'. Visit La Marina Cafeteria, located in a corner of the square with the flower merchants, or buy hot sugary churros from one of the stalls next to the market. You can purchase a mug of traditional thick hot chocolate from any bar, where you can sit and enjoy the churros you just bought.

You can stroll through the historic centre and lose yourself in the one of many narrow, cobble stoned streets or visit the Dark Room at the Tavira Tower, the Western Tower (Torre de Poniente) in the Cathedral of Cadiz.

There are great views over the city from Plaza de San Juan de Dios. Take a stroll along the Playa de la Caleta (Little Cove Beach), where the boats rest under the attentive gaze of the Castles of Santa Catalina (on the right) and San Sebastián (in the background), where films have been shot including Tomorrow Never Dies (James Bond). Next stop is the Castle of San Sebastián. To get there, cross the Puente Canal (next to the Playa de la Caleta) on foot which is a lovely walk. From the other castle, Santa Catalina, you can see one of the most beautiful sunsets you have ever seen.

Roam along the Campo del Sur, which many people claim is very similar to the Malecon in Havana. And if you still have energy and time, you can reach the Playa de la Victoria on foot, and from there to the Playa de Cortadura, which borders Cadiz along the coastline and is a pleasant stroll.

JEREZ

Strolling around this city will give you a chance to get to know and discover wine and horse culture first hand. You can visit a wine cellar 'bodega' to see how wine is produced, and even go to a wine tasting (Bodegas González Byass, Bodegas Lustau or Bodegas Tradición to name a few).

However, Jerez is not only characterised by its wine and unique architecture but offers much more. It is home to the Carthusian horse, the cradle of flamenco, a city of motor racing and has an historically rich city centre.

With regard to horses, there are two extremely well-known equestrian shows: 'How Andalusian Horses Dance', at the Andalusian Royal School of Equestrian Art (Tuesday and Thursday at noon) and 'Carthusian Horse Studs' (Saturdays at 11:00.

Jerez offers the very best of Flamenco (daily) in its famous Tablaos, in addition to some very interesting flamenco performances: from flamenco recitals in numerous Peña Flamenca clubs to be found dotted around the city and the traditional Bulería Festival (September), to the famous Jerez International Flamenco Festival which takes place each year (Feb-Mar).

VEJER DE LA FRONTERA

The town was declared a Historical Site and awarded the National Prize for the Beautification of Andalusian Towns. It is perched on a hilltop overlooking the River Barbate.

The town has many outstanding churches: the Divino Salvador Parish Church which overlooks the town; the Monjas Concepcionistas Church with its stunning Las Monjas Arch; the Hospedería de San Francisco Convent; and, on the outskirts of the town, Nuestra Señora de la Oliva hermitage. The most outstanding civil buildings in the town are the Baroque Palace of the Marquis of Tamarón and the Mayorazgo.

Vejer de la Frontera is only 9km from one of the most famous beaches on the coast of Cadiz, the El Palmar Beach. This beach has more than 4km of fine golden sand beaches and, when the wind blows, provides a great area for windsurfers.

ZAHARA DE LA SIERRA

The white village of Zahara de la Sierra has one of the most stunning settings in the province of Cadiz. This mountain village is situated in the Sierra de Grazalema Natural Park. Its hillside position imbues the village with an unusual urban appearance. In the pretty town centre, the Santa María de la Mesa Church, the San Juan de Letrán Chapel, the Torre del Reloj (Clock Tower) and the Palominos Bridge are of particular interest.

The famous fiesta of Corpus Christi has been declared to be of National Tourist Interest. During the festival not only can you marvel at the sight of the meticulous ornamentation, you can taste the local cuisine, with dishes such as the "quemones de cebolla" (a tomato dip with onion and parsley), the "sopas hervías" (bread and tomato soup) and the sugary tipsy cakes.

Apart from the amazing panoramic views, the Zahara-El Gastor Reservoir offers many opportunities to enjoy various sports activities. In the Arroyomolinos Recreational Area, visitors can swim from an artificial beach in the heart of the Sierra de Cadiz.

JAÉN

The varied geography of the province of Jaén offers the beauty of its natural landscapes and the architecture and monuments of its villages and cities which keep alive the memory of past splendour. Large expanses of gentle landscapes with olive groves stretch out over the horizon. Among the olives and the lush vegetation of its nature reserves you will find outstanding examples of Iberian art, churches, cathedrals, palaces and castles built in the Gothic, Renaissance or Baroque style. Jaén is a land of excellent olive oil, and offers a dreamlike landscape for anyone passing through the Despeñaperros ravine which leads to the south.

Discover the Natural Park Sierra Magina

Enjoy a nice route by jeep 4x4 with the best views of Jaén. The Sierra Mágina Natural Park has the highest altitude of the province. During the trip you can see the flora and fauna of this wonderful natural environment.
