# Nyhavn

Nørrebro is the real Copenhagen. Here you will find atmospheric lanes, squares with impromptu street entertainment, an oasis of shops and restaurants and the Assistens Cemetry.



## Cycling

The streets of Copenhagen are awash with bikes. It is the original bike city with 400km of bike lanes criss-crossing the capital. It is the best way to explore the compact capital's famous landmarks.



### Architecture

For architectural gems, look no further than the Black Diamond an angular extension of the Royal Danish Library, the modern Opera House and the stock exchange, Borsen with its spire of four entwined dragons.

# Copenhagen Admiral Hotel, Copenhagen

The Copenhagen Admiral Hotel occupies one of the best positions in Copenhagen, directly on the waterfront and a short walk from Nyhavn and a gentle stroll from Amalienborg Palace.

A former warehouse (from 1787), the property is handsomely rustic with wooden beams and teak furniture. The history of the Admiral Hotel, from its origins as a granary store through to a provider of hotel accommodation, is told through the interior design, photographs and artefacts which line the guest rooms and public areas. The result is a historic property which offers contemporary accommodation of the highest standard.

# Absalon Hotel, Copenhagen

Founded in 1938 the recently renovated Absalon Hotel provides a comfortable stay in the popular Vesterbro district of Copenhagen, an area known for its lively vibe and popular restaurants.

One of Copenhagen's oldest familyowned hotels, the property is today managed by Karen Nedergaard, grandchild of the founding owners, who has incorporated vibrant colours throughout the hotel to complement the original architecture. Priding itself on genuine hospitality, the hotel offers Concept24 – a concept which, if booked in advance, allows guests to keep their room for 24 hours, no matter what time they arrive.

# The capitals of Scandinavia: Copenhagen, Stockholm and Oslo

Itinerary: 10 days / 9 nights

The cities of Copenhagen, Stockholm and Oslo are some of the most picturesque and natural in Europe with their lush parklands, shimmering waterways, medieval centres, world-class museums and innovative, modern architecture attracting visitors. Our nine night itinerary visits the capitals of Scandinavia and offers free time for exploration.

Day One: On arrival at Copenhagen airport, self-transfer to the Absalon Hotel in Copenhagen. Overnight at the Absalon Hotel in Copenhagen (page 93).

Day Two and Three: For a first time visitor, we would recommend that you explore the city on foot or by using one of the city bikes. The centre of Copenhagen is compact and easily navigable – you can reach most sites from anywhere in the inner city within a 20-minute walk. Another option is to take a 1-hour cruise through the canals of the city, passing the Little Mermaid, the Royal Palace, the Opera House and the Black Diamond library - this is a great way to learn about the city and to see the primary sites. We would also recommend exploring the districts of Christianshavn and Nørrebro; enjoying some retail therapy on the longest pedestrianised shopping street in the world, Strøget and to visit the harbour of Nyhavn. Overnight at the Absalon Hotel in Copenhagen.

Day Four: After breakfast, depart Copenhagen by train and travel to the capital of Sweden, Stockholm (c,5 hours). On arrival in Stockholm, self-transfer to the Nobis Hotel in the centre of the city. Overnight at the Nobis Hotel, Stockholm (page 13).

Day Five and Six: Free time in Stockholm. Opportunity to explore one of the most picturesque cities in Europe and one of the most natural. Be sure not to miss the fascinating Vasa Museum, Skansen, the ABBA Museum and the Fotografiska Museum. Why not take a cruise in the inner archipelago or to the historical sites of Drottningholm Slott or Gripsholm Castle or, hire a city bike and visit the Ladugårdsgärdet Park and climb to the top of the Kaknäs TV Tower, the tallest building in the city, for a breathtaking panoramas? Overnight at the Nobis Hotel in Stockholm. Day Seven: After breakfast, depart Stockholm by train and travel to Oslo (c,6 hours). On arrival in Oslo, self-transfer to the Continental Hotel. Overnight at the Continental Hotel in Oslo (page 53).

Day Eight and Nine: At the head of the Oslofjord, the Norwegian capital is compact and easy to get around. The central sights of Akershus Fortress, Royal Palace, Opera House and the harbourfront are all within a 15-minute walk of the main street of Karl Johans gate. The museums of the Bygdøy peninsula, the new sculpture park of Ekebergparken, the National Gallery, and the natural park of Holmenkollen are other unmissable attractions in the city. It is during the summer months that Oslo really comes into its own. Take a boat excursion on the Oslofjord, visit its island archipelago, sunbathe, swim and enjoy lunch in one of the many waterfront restaurants. Alternatively, prebook a full day Norway in a nutshell tour visiting the Aurlandsfjord, Naeroyfjord and the fjord-side village of Flåm. Overnight at the Continental Hotel in Oslo.

Day Ten: After breakfast, self transfer to Oslo Gardermoen airport for your return flight to the UK.
