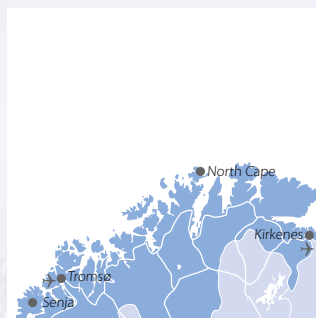


Northern Norway including Svalbard

Northern Norway's weather beaten landscape of high mountain peaks, protected inlets, farmland and idyllic fishing villages can only be described as a masterpiece almost untouched by time.



Just 1000km south of the North Pole, the untamed wild and wildlife of the Svalbard archipelago is guaranteed to capture the heart of all explorers.

1 Wildlife

Look up and you might see a Golden Eagle, White Tailed Eagle, Gannets, Puffins, or Kittiwakes. Take a boat trip to see sperm, humpback, minke, orca and pilot whales. Not to mention moose, reindeer, walrus and the infamous polar bear.



2 Illuminating Arctic lights

The sun does not rise above the horizon in Tromsø from 21 Nov – 21 Jan and in Longyearbyen from 27 Oct – 14 Feb. When the sun returns, it brings with it an array of colours.

3 Viking heritage

The Lofotr Viking Museum at Borg (Lofoten) is a full-size reconstruction of a Chieftain's longhouse and holds an exhibition of original artefacts. The quality of archaeological finds on display is extraordinary.



4 Pyramiden

The Russian coal mining settlement is situated at the end of the Isfjord in Svalbard. Evacuated in 1998, Pyramiden is a ghost town trapped in time, slowly decomposing. Eerie and fascinating.

The Lofoten

With craggy alpine peaks, expanses of white sandy beaches, colourful fishing hamlets in sheltered ports and verdant agricultural communities, the Lofoten archipelago is the jewel of Norway. Be prepared to be amazed by the beauty of this 100km chain of islands.

Svinøya Rorbuer, Svolvær

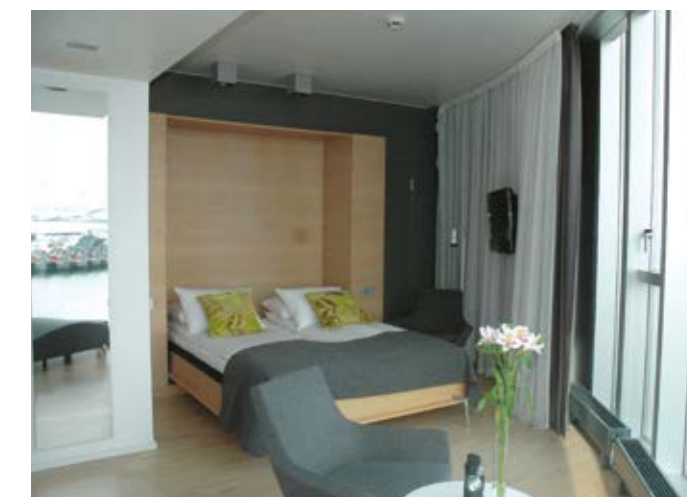
Svinøya is the oldest district of Svolvær and it was here that the first shop was established and where the first trading activities began in 1828. During the early 19th century, a row of cabins were built to accommodate the visiting fishermen during the Lofoten winter cod season.

Today, a number of the original cabins are offered by Svinøya Rorbuer as tourist accommodation. In addition to the traditional Rorbuer, the Svinøya offers a selection of newly built cabins and suites each enjoying sea views.

Reine Rorbuer stands at the mouth of the Reinefjord on the south-western tip of the Lofoten archipelago, on the island of Moskenesøy. Surrounded by blue ocean waters and with the majestic summits of the 'Lofotveggen' range as its backdrop, this is a truly picturesque setting.

The 36 cabins of Reine Rorbuer, once housing the visiting fishermen during the winter months, have been carefully restored and renovated. The red wooden structures have been warmed with colourful textiles and modern conveniences, whilst the atmosphere of yesteryear has been retained.

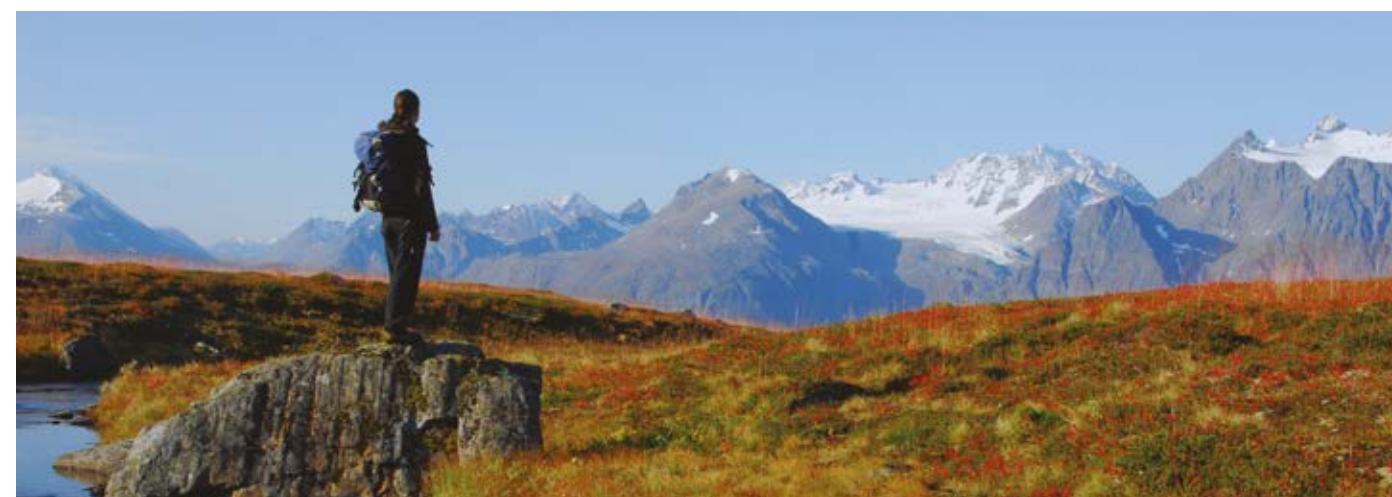

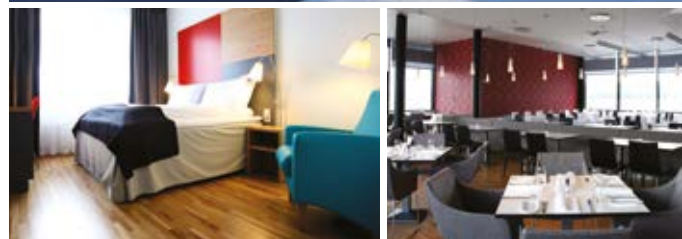
Thon Hotel Kirkenes, Kirkenes

Isfjord Radio Station, Cape Linnè

Cape Linnè, on the island of Spitsbergen, is home to the Isfjord Radio Station, originally an important telecommunications link between Svalbard and mainland Norway.

Established in 1933, 90km away from the civilisation of Longyearbyen, the station was destroyed during the Second World War before being re-built. Today parts of the old establishment have been preserved and in 2013 Isfjord Radio was awarded the St Olav's Rose – the hallmark of Norwegian Heritage.

During the winter, when a blanket of snow covers the island (October

to May), the property is reached by snowmobile or dog sled and in the summer (June to August) arrival is by boat, across the Isfjord.

Summer in Northern Norway Lofoten - Reine - Svolveaer

Departures: Daily
Duration: 7 nights

The most unique aspect of Northern Norway is its wild and beautiful landscape, and the Lofoten archipelago is considered to be the most spectacular of all. A distinctive landscape of precipitous mountains and sharp peaks combine with sheltered bays, white sand beaches and traditional fishing communities to form a backdrop that once seen, is never forgotten.

Day One:
On arrival at Leknes airport, collect your hire car and drive to the south-western tip of the Lofoten archipelago and the village of Reine. Overnight at the Reine Rorbuer in Reine (page 55).

Day Two:
Day at leisure. Opportunity to explore the southern islands of the archipelago: Moskenes and Flakstadøya. At every turn the mountainous peaks and picturesque ports of the Lofoten beg to be photographed. It is easy to see why so many artists have been drawn to these magnificent isles. The light here is very special and only enhances the splendour of this awe-inspiring scene. Overnight at the Reine Rorbuer in Reine.

Day Three:
Day at leisure. Take a cruise on the Reinefjord (Jun-Aug) to the village of Vindstad and then continue your journey on foot to the beach at Bunesstranda (1-hour each way). Overnight at the Reine Rorbuer in Reine.

Day Four:
A national tourist route (scenic drive) has been developed in the Lofoten, linking the village of Å to Raftsundet in the north. The Lofoten archipelago is blessed with some of the most spectacular scenery in Norway: craggy alpine peaks, glistening white sandy beaches, fishing hamlets and verdant agricultural communities. Today, take a leisurely drive through this diverse landscape, along the tourist route, on your way to Svolveaer. Overnight at the Svinøya Rorbuer in Svolveaer (page 55).

Day Five:
Day at leisure. Opportunity to explore the islands of Vestvågøy and Austgågøya. In particular we would recommend a visit to the Viking museum at Borg, home to the largest-known Viking chieftain's house. During the summer months, the sun continues to bathe the mountains and fjords in a golden glow at midnight. The beach of Eggum on the island of Vestvågøy is one of the best spots from which to observe the natural phenomenon. Overnight at the Svinøya Rorbuer in Svolveaer.

Day Six:
The village of Henningsvaer, situated at the foot of Mount Vågakallen, has more than its fair share of art galleries, handicraft shops and workshops and is worthy of a visit. From Henningsvaer, it is possible to participate in a Midnight Sun safari (23 May – 24 Jul), snorkelling trip (15 Jun – 15 Aug) and a sea eagle excursion (15 Jun – 15 Aug). Overnight at the Svinøya Rorbuer in Svolveaer.

Day Seven:
Day at leisure. Time to explore the port town of Svolveaer or to take a hike in the mountains. Overnight at the Svinøya Rorbuer in Svolveaer.

Drive to Svolveaer airport for the return flight to the UK.

Tromsø, Björkliden and the ICEHOTEL

Departures: Dec – Apr

The illumination of the Northern Lights occurs when charged solar particles collide with atoms and molecules in the Earth's atmosphere. Green bursts of light are most commonly witnessed; these are collisions with oxygen atoms 100-200km above the surface of the Earth. Blue colours are collisions with nitrogen atoms at the same distance, whilst oxygen atoms glow red when excited by the solar particles.

Our seven night itinerary combines Tromsø, considered one of the best places in the world to see the natural phenomenon of the Aurora Borealis; the Swedish mountain resorts of Björkliden and the world-famous ICEHOTEL in Jukkasjärvi, all destinations are above the Arctic Circle and situated under the Aurora oval.

Day One:
On arrival at Tromsø airport, you will be transferred to the Thon Hotel Tromsø. Overnight at the Thon Hotel Tromsø in Tromsø (featured on our website).

Day Two:
Day at leisure in Tromsø. On a clear night it is possible to see the Northern Lights from Tromsø although, we would always recommend leaving the artificial lights of the city for the best chance of a sighting. Alternatively, head to the Arctic Cathedral for a midnight concert (dates permitting).

Overnight at the Thon Hotel Tromsø in Tromsø.

Day Three:

Aurora hunt
Day at leisure in Tromsø. Opportunity to participate in a dog-sled or snowmobile excursion; take the cable car to Mount

Storsteinen for a fantastic view over the city; or learn about the Aurora Borealis at the Science Centre of Northern Norway.

In the evening, depart Tromsø on a 6-hour Aurora hunt. This small group tour will take you in search of the Lady Aurora and will travel to whichever location is deemed to have the best atmospheric conditions for a sighting. Overnight at the Thon Hotel Tromsø in Tromsø.

Day Four:

Aurora photo tour
Depart Tromsø by bus and travel to the harbour town of Narvik (c. 4 hours) before continuing by train to the Björkliden Mountain Resort on the outskirts of the Abisko National Park (c.2 hours). Self-transfer from Björkliden train station to the Björkliden Mountain Resort (c.10 minutes walk) - see page 33.

In the evening, participate in an Aurora photo tour in the Abisko National Park. Under the supervision of a professional photographer you will have a high chance of going home with beautiful Aurora photographs and memories that will last a lifetime.

Evening meal and overnight at Björkliden Mountain Resort in Björkliden.

Day Five:

Northern Lights tour by dog sled
Day at leisure in Björkliden. Opportunity to participate in a snowmobile tour, snow shoe tour and to visit an ice cave. Alternatively, there are 19 ski runs and 24 km of cross-country ski trails to try (dates permitting).

In the evening, we have included a 2 hour dog sled tour for you. On the tour you will not only meet the Alaskan huskies but, will have the opportunity to help harness them if you desire. Afterwards, you will take your seat on the sled (snuggled under warming

reindeer skins) and head off into the Arctic darkness in search of the Northern Lights. Your sled will be steered by an experienced musher.

Evening meal and overnight at the Björkliden Mountain Resort in Björkliden.

Day Six:

Northern Lights snowmobile tour
After breakfast, transfer to Jukkasjärvi and the location of the original ICEHOTEL (c.90 minutes drive). This evening, before settling down to sleep in your ornately decorated Art Suite, you will enjoy a snowmobile tour in search of the Northern Lights. An evening meal is included as part of the tour.

Overnight in cold accommodation at the ICEHOTEL in Jukkasjärvi (see page 32)

Day Seven:

Day at leisure in Jukkasjärvi. Opportunity to participate in a reindeer sled excursion or to try your hand at ice sculpting or cross-country skiing.

Overnight at the ICEHOTEL in Jukkasjärvi (warm accommodation).

Day Eight:

After breakfast, transfer to Kiruna airport for your return flight to the UK.

As the snow melts around Longyearbyen, the incredible geological makeup of the Svalbard archipelago can be observed and the mountain peaks, valleys and open tundra become accessible with a local guide. Join a boat excursion on the Isfjord to witness the drifting sea ice, glacial cliffs and to explore the tidal shores rich in fossils. It is also possible to visit the abandoned mining settlement of Pyramiden and the Russian settlement of Barentsburg.

Combining the high Arctic with the university city of Tromsø, this 7-night itinerary allows you to explore and experience two of the highlights of Northern Norway. Cultural interactions, majestic scenery, delicious local cuisine and memorable experiences are guaranteed.

Day One:

On arrival at Longyearbyen airport, self transfer to the Trapper's Hotel in the centre of the town.

Overnight at the Trapper's Hotel in Longyearbyen (see page 59)

Day Two:

Guided tour of Longyearbyen

The archipelago of Svalbard is like nowhere else on earth, and it is only with a guided tour that you will truly understand the islands - their geology, history and modern-day life. This morning, we have included a 3-hour minibus excursion of the capital which will provide a welcoming insight into the

islands. Afternoon and evening at leisure.

Overnight at the Trapper's Hotel in Longyearbyen

Day Three:

Boat excursion to Pyramiden and Nordenskiöld Glacier

After breakfast, you will be met by a local guide and transferred to the waterfront in Longyearbyen for your full day boat excursion to Pyramiden, an abandoned Russian mining settlement. Your cruise will leisurely sail inland along the Isfjord and Billefjord. Wrap up warm, and take your seat on the deck to enjoy the passing scenery - bird cliffs, drifting sea ice and the vibrant blue glacier of Nordenskiöld. At Pyramiden you will have time to explore the ghost town, last inhabited in 1998.

Overnight at the Trapper's Hotel in Longyearbyen

Day Four:

Fossil hunting on foot

Today, enjoy a 3-hour hiking tour on the moraine of the Longyear Glacier. Away from the town, the nature is silent, untouched and covered by gravel, small lichen, miniature grass and arctic flowers. It is also possible to uncover fossils amongst the landscape, and if you find a plant fossil you can take it home as a souvenir.

Overnight at the Trapper's Hotel in Longyearbyen

Day Five:

After breakfast, self transfer to Longyearbyen airport for your flight to Tromsø. On arrival in the largest city in Northern Norway, you will be transferred to the Clarion Hotel The Edge.

Overnight at the Clarion Hotel The Edge in Tromsø (see page 56).

Days Six and Seven:

Days at leisure in Tromsø. Opportunity to explore this evocative city and its museums and attractions. We would highly recommend taking the cable car towards the summit of Mount Storsteinen (421m) which affords a panoramic view over the city and its surrounding archipelago. Alternatively, why not join one of the many excursions which depart from the city? From boat tours and fishing, kayaking and hiking trips to glacial tours, there is something for everyone. Evening at leisure in Tromsø.

Hurtigruten Coastal Express

The Hurtigruten Coastal Express has been breathing life into Norway's remote coastal villages for over a century providing a vital transportation link for residents, mail and supplies.

Today, the vessels are also used to transport visitors long the beautiful North Sea coastline from Bergen across the Arctic Circle to Kirkenes on the Russian border.
