





Bolivia

Colossal variations in altitude provide Bolivia with some of the world's richest biodiversity and contrast – dazzling salt flats, staggering Andean peaks, Amazonian rainforests and crystal lakes. Landlocked, rugged, challenging, this most indigenous of South American countries offers an intense, breathtaking experience.

At a glance

- Lake Titicaca, high in the Andes, sacred to the Inca and Aymara
- Salt flats at Uyuni, the largest in the world
- Pre-Inca site at Tiwanaku, dating from 1500 B.C.
- Southern Altiplano, stark and unsettling
- Madidi National Park – the most bio-diverse protected area in the world
- Vast range of flora and fauna, including toucans, parrots, vicuna, flamingos, condors, and even the Andean spectacled bear
- Rich folklore and culture of 60% indigenous population (Quechua, Aymara, Guarani)
- Amazon Basin dry season April-October
- Altiplano extremely cold (especially at night) June- August
- Combines well with Peru or the Atacama in Chile

- Potosi – 1 night with a visit to the National Mint and a Silver Mine

La Paz to the Atacama 2 nights

- A spectacular overland journey covering some of South America's most unique and stunning scenery
- Travel by road from La Paz to Oruro and then by train to Uyuni
- Salar d'Uyuni 1 night – stay at a hotel made from salt overlooking the bright white salt flats
- Travel by 4WD vehicle from Uyuni south to Hito el Cajon border crossing, then descend to San Pedro de Atacama
- Overnight in the hamlet of San Pedro de Quemez
- Spectacular scenery including the Red and Green Lagoons, smoking volcanoes, wind sculpted rock-formations and bubbling fumaroles
- Pink flamingos on the lagoons
- Mostly all off-road and bumpy in parts
